This year the Festival Lecture will be a joint presentation by the nationally renowned nature writer Patrick Barkham and the National Trust's Matthew Oates who will offer a collaborative reflection on the concept of 'The Spirit of Place'.

Norfolk has some of the richest and most distinctive countryside in Britain. The long-term aim of the Norfolk Festival of Nature will be to celebrate the central place of landscape and wildlife in the cultural life of our county. It will showcase artists of all kind – poets, writers, composers, photographers, film makers, sound recordists, sculptors, painters and scientists – whose work draws primarily upon the natural world. It is hoped that the Festival will build outwards and involve both artists and scientists in events and residencies on the properties and reserves of all the key stakeholders in the environmental field, as well as private landowners and farmers sympathetic to the project.

The Spirit of Place Patrick Barkham and Matthew Oates

Matthew Oates is a naturalist, author and broadcaster who has worked for the National Trust for 25 years. His main passions are butterflies, humour and the poetic approach. He writes for The Times Nature Notes column.
